Atlanta's oldest city park invites you to participate in our annual fall festival, *Sunday in the Park*. The Victorian inspired event is sponsored by Historic Oakland Foundation and takes place in the beautiful and unique surroundings of Oakland Cemetery in the Grant Park neighborhood, just minutes from downtown, I-20 and I-75/85.

This year's event is scheduled for Sunday, October 2 from noon-6pm.

The festival features a variety of live musical entertainment, living history demonstrations, an antique auto display, Irish dancers and an opportunity to enter some of the magnificent mausoleums. Visitors are encouraged to participate in our Victorian costume and photography contests. Carriage tours and free walking tours will be offered while Oakland's beloved Teddy Bear Tea and traditional games will entertain "kids" of all ages. More than 5,000 visitors attended last year's festivities.

**ABOUT HISTORIC OAKLAND FOUNDATION AND CEMETERY:**

Oakland Cemetery is located less than one mile from the heart of downtown Atlanta. Founded in 1850, this rural garden cemetery is the final resting place of many of Atlanta's settlers, builders and noted citizens like Bobby Jones, Margaret Mitchell and Maynard Jackson. It is also a showplace of sculpture and architecture and a botanical preserve with ancient oaks and magnolias. Oakland Cemetery is a significant example of the city's rich and fascinating history.

As the 20<sup>th</sup> century unfolded, Oakland fell into serious disrepair from neglect and occasional vandalism. In an effort to address the needs of Oakland, the Historic Oakland Foundation was founded in 1976, the same year Oakland was placed on the National Register of Historic Places. Working with the city, the Foundation has done much to stabilize the cemetery. Despite progress, deterioration will continue until a comprehensive and systematic restoration and preservation effort is completed. # Vendor Guidelines

## Sunday in the Park

October 2, 2011  
12:00 noon – 6:00 pm

- Oakland Foundation reserves the right to refuse any application and to require removal of any item(s) considered to be objectionable. Vendors not submitting a website representative of the items for sale will be asked to provide photos of their items / booth for committee approval.
- Fees: Vendor registration is \$75 if received by September 01, 2011. After that time, registration is \$100. Please make all checks payable to Historic Oakland Foundation. Send completed registration and check to:

- All proceeds from the registration fees help support the Foundation's goals of restoration and preservation of Historic Oakland Cemetery. You may choose to donate a portion of your sales to the effort, which will go directly to benefit the cemetery's restoration.
- Registration secures one artist slot to be assigned by the SIP committee. We will attempt to honor all requests to return to a favorite spot or assign adjacent spots.
- State Sales Tax: All artists/vendors are responsible for collecting the 8% sales tax for the State of Georgia and Fulton County.
- Cancellation: If you cancel your registration prior to September 1, 2011 you will receive a full refund for registration fees. No refunds will be given for cancellations after that date.
- Set Up: Vendors will be able to unload between 9am and 11am on the day of the festival. All vehicles must be removed from the park by 11am. Please refrain from driving on any brick pathways. Electricity or generator power will not be provided. The exhibitor must provide all displays including tables and chairs. All booth spaces will be 10'x10'. Tents will be allowed if they do not exceed 10'x10'. Tents must be secured on all supports with weights, no staking will be allowed. Tying tents to trees or monuments will not be allowed.
- All vendors must provide a certificate of flammability for their tent or display.
- Clean Up: Clean up and load-out will begin promptly at 6:00 pm. All vendors must pick up their space and assure the area is clean and free of litter. Trash bags may be placed curbside at your vendor space.
